**NOTES:** Data were collected on these students, who at entry of the cohort, were awarded a Pell Grant and students who were awarded a Subsidized Stafford loan, but did not receive a Pell Grant. Graduation rates are the Student Right-to-Know rates.

Graduation rates are defined as the total number of individuals from a given cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates who completed a degree or certificate within a given percent of normal time to complete all requirements of the degree or certificate program; divided by the the total number of students in the cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates minus any allowable exclusions, diaggregated by financial aid type.
