

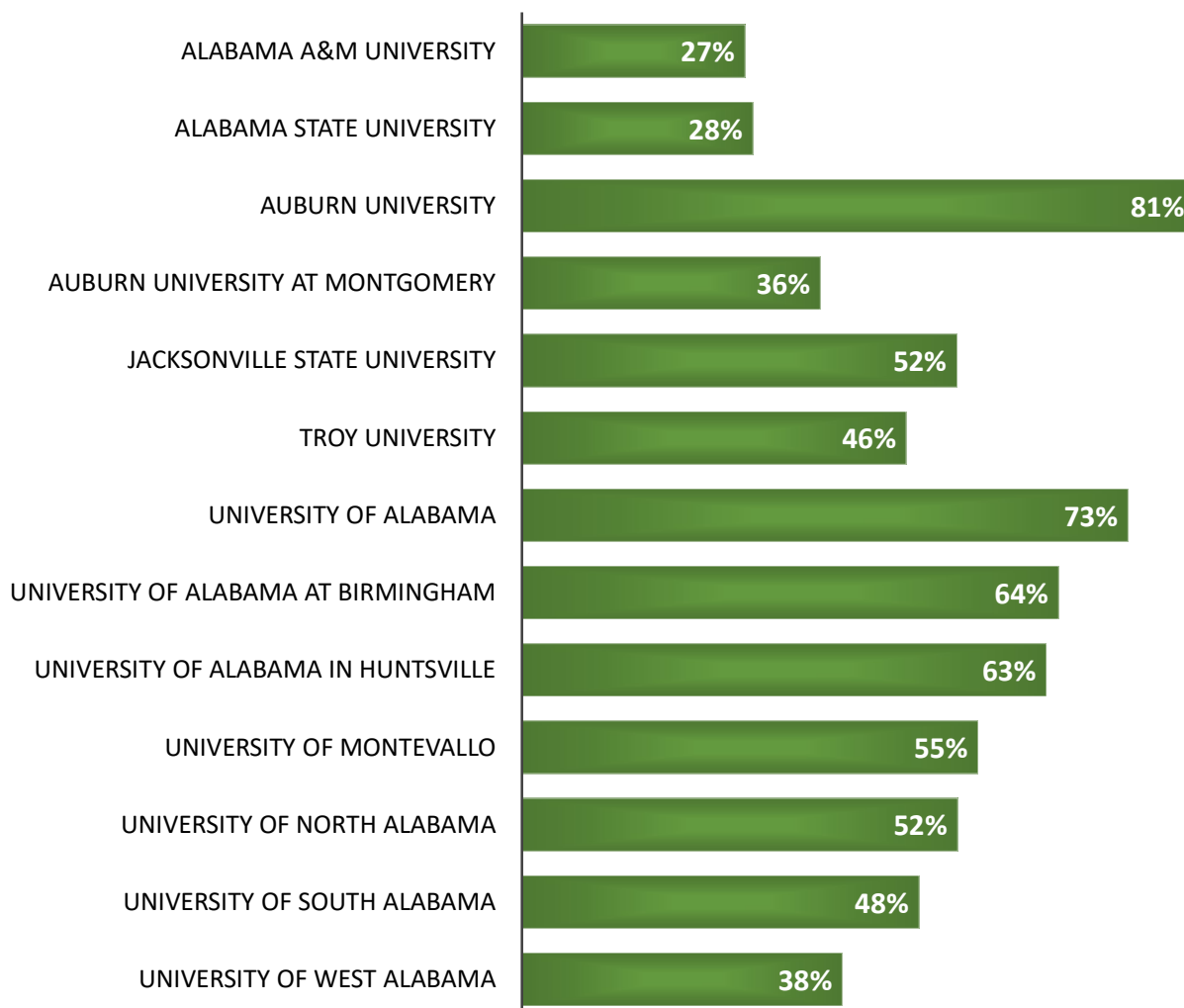

NOTES: Public universities are sanctioned by the state to serve a particular purpose. Universities that have less selective admission policies and serve a greater number of students requiring financial aid tend to have lower retention and graduation rates. Graduation rates are defined as the total number of individuals from a given cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates who completed a degree or certificate within a given percent of normal time to complete all requirements of the degree or certificate program; divided by the total number of students in the cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates minus any allowable exclusions.

Athens State University is an upper division institution and therefore is not included in this report.
