NOTES: Two-year colleges serve the State with different purposes. One primary purpose is to help students gain general education competencies to prepare them to successfully transfer to a four-year institution. Another primary purpose is to prepare students with credentials to enter the workforce in high-skilled positions. Therefore, it is important to consider students who complete their programs, students who transfer, and students who are retained from year one to year two as students who succeed. Outcome success rates include completers, students retained, and students who transferred at any time within the reporting year. Due to the nature of the population it serves, Ingram State Technical College is not included in this report. Additionally, ISTC does not participate in the National Student Clearinghouse Post-Secondary Data Partnership, so comparable data is not available.

The **MAIN COHORT** includes “all first -time students who entered the institution for the first time post high school completion and are enrolled in credit or developmental education classes in the fall term.”
