NARRATIVE

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT: (1) In the space below, discuss the goals of the project. What do you hope to achieve?

NACC -- Design an ART100 course that utilizes open educational resources (OER) to reduce out-of-pocket costs to students, while still exhibiting the same rigor as a text-based ART100 course. Utilize a studio-based teaching-learning model to help students find personal meaning in works of art and develop a better understanding of the nature and validity of art.

BISHOP -- Goals for this endeavor are multifaceted, and focused on improving both financial and learning outcomes for the student population. Reducing the cost of materials for students is a major incentive, many of our students are receiving financial aid and reducing the portion that is required for books would be of great help. Having materials available immediately, when or even before classes begin would also be an advantage. In this technological age, there is a necessity that students have the ability to access online resources, this could facilitate that skill. Exploring the benefits of utilizing OER in a standard curated method will help not only students at our institution, but also give a statistical measure for many.

Beyond the basic goals of the grant, another objective of this project is to provide new data for use in various future academic and business research studies about student and consumer choice/preference/satisfaction, service delivery, and the effect of changes on both the student-consumer and the institution-firm.

BISHOP -- Currently students in the Art 100 course at this institution use the online textbook and associated online resource; **Living with Art by Mark Geitlin.** ed 11. NACC -- Student learning materials are a combination of publisher printed text, e-book, electronic flashcards, vocabulary and pronunciation guide, videos, and quizzes that can have a combined cost of more than \$150/student. Goals:

- Replace all publisher created materials with existing OER materials or instructor created materials
- Restructure the course to reflect a model that will engage our students and promote active learning

NACC -- Institutional support for this project will be from the three team members, the Division Chair of English and Fine Arts, the acting Dean of Instruction/VP, and the college President. Research by Dr. Julia Everett; Content Development by Barbara Kilgore; Instructional Design by Judith Lea.

BISHOP -- An overload stipend will be paid to the lead instructor for the Fall term by the institution. The college will support the staff with flexibility in schedules regarding the time associated with the project. Where necessary the college will allow relief from committee work or other ancillary projects in order to provide institutional focus on this initiative. The graphic arts department has the ability to help create/edit/post and share digital content. Information systems and swift app development program can explore the use of mobile application technologies and usage in OER delivery.

If necessary (and where barriers exist w/electronic access) the campus bookstore can make OER materials available for a "print on demand fee" below the low cost threshold.

NACC -- This course will also serve as a model for other Northeast Alabama Community College instructors who would like to transition from publisher-based teaching to OER-based teaching models. This course will be housed and updated on Creative Commons allowing this project to provide an OER-based course content library which can be adopted and/or adapted by other two and four-year institutions interested in implementing the OER model at their institution.

BISHOP -- The Vice president of operations for the College, and the Humanities Chair are in complete support of the exploration and successful implementation of OER at this institution. I have every reason to believe that the support would continue from these positions. The administration at this College has

promoted this endeavor to the faculty by supporting professional development conferences at area institutions and actively supporting this project.

SUSTAINABILITY PLAN: What is your plan for offering the course in the future, including maintenance, enhancement, and updating of course materials?

Supporting the endeavor to utilize OER resources would need to be an ongoing effort. All instructors teaching the course would implement the structured use of OER materials in Summer 2019. There will be an evaluation at the conclusion of Summer of 2019 when implemented to compare and evaluate across the department success. Meetings with other Colleges to share and improve the application would be planned to ensure the highest level of educational materials ensuring student success.
